PRAYERS FOR ORLANDO NIGHTCLUB VICTIMS AND FAMILIES

On Tuesday, Bishop John led the Reflection in the Scottish Parliament and stood with the House in a one-minute silence to remember the victims of the Orlando nightclub massacre and their families. Pope Francis reacted in "horror" after learning of the shootings and said that "the terrible massacre, with its dreadfully high number of innocent victims, has caused in all of us the deepest feelings of horror and condemnation, of pain and turmoil before this new manifestation of homicidal folly and senseless hatred." Pope Francis assured the victims' families of his prayers.
